

Rainelle, WV is a quaint rural community with a population of about 1,500 residents. Nestled in the beautiful hills of western Greenbrier County, this quiet community sits on the historical Midland Trail (US Highway 60). Rainelle is probably most famous for being the home of the Meadow River Lumber Company, the largest hardwood lumber band mill in the world during its years of operation. A little less known, but significant, feature is the Rainelle United Methodist Church, still holding regular services, which is thought to be the largest structure in the world built entirely of American Chestnut lumber. Although being a small country town with only one traffic light, Rainelle has much to offer those who make this area their home.
