One of the best maintained and cared for ranches that I have listed or sold. Really shows pride of ownership. Ranch is well watered with a large reservoir, 2 windmill wells and the North Fork and South Fork of Coal Creek, which are seasonal creeks that flow most of the year and have put holes that have water year around. 2 electric wells, one at the house and the other in the east pasture by the county road. Owner presently runs 350 head of mother cows, but the ranch will handle 150-175 depending upon the year. The balance of cattle is run on private leases, which the new owner could possibly get. There is 700 acres of dryland alfalfa hay puts up 1-1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ton of hay, again the hay produced depends upon the rain fall. Fences are all in excellent condition.

The homes on this ranch are exceptional, nothing fancy just nice modern comfortable homes. All the buildings are connected by an alley system with corrals making it very easy to sort cattle. A wind fence surrounds most of the buildings and the corrals. Very nice for those windy winter days. Owner just built a 60x90 pole barn with 14 ft. walls and 3-14 foot doors. He will use this to put his heavys in during calving seasons. A very nice ranch.
