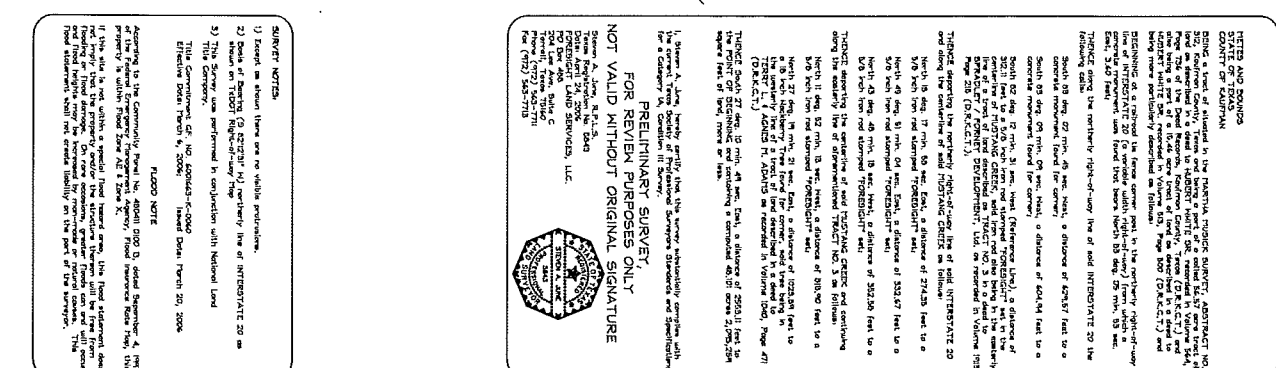
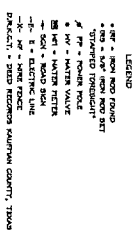




During a series of studies in the *Journal of Interpersonal Violence*, Andrew J. Elliot and his colleagues have shown that the mere presence of a handgun in a room is associated with an increase in hostile thoughts and feelings. In a recent study, Elliot and his colleagues examined the effects of the mere presence of a handgun on the behavior of a group of 16 college students in a laboratory setting. The students were randomly assigned to one of two groups: a control group and an experimental group. The control group was seated in a room that contained no handgun, and the experimental group was seated in a room that contained a handgun. The students were then asked to complete a series of tasks, including a word association test, a decision-making task, and a conflict-resolution task. The results of the study showed that the experimental group, which was exposed to the handgun, performed worse on all three tasks compared to the control group. Specifically, the experimental group showed a higher number of hostile thoughts and feelings, a lower number of correct decisions, and a higher number of conflicts. These findings suggest that the mere presence of a handgun in a room can have a negative impact on human behavior, leading to an increase in hostile thoughts and feelings and a decrease in decision-making and conflict-resolution skills. This study has important implications for the understanding of the effects of guns on human behavior and for the development of interventions to reduce gun-related violence.
