## IN THE HEART OF OIL COUNTRY

- 13.9 million The number of barrels of oil being produced each month in North Dakota as of October. That's nearly 500,000 barrels a day.
- 2 The state is the second highest oil producing state in the country, trailing only Texas. Mountrail county is the leading oil producing county, followed in order by McKenzie County, Williams County and Dunn County, which together produce nearly 11 million barrels of the state's monthly total. North Dakota was the 9th largest oil producing state just 6 years ago, but the state's oil production has nearly quadrupled since 2007.
- 206 The drilling rig count as of March 31, 2012, compared to March 2011 when there were 172 rigs drilling (an increase of 19.8% this past year).
- 95 percent the amount of drilling in the state that targets the Bakken and Three Forks formations.
- 6,202 The number of producing oil wells in North Dakota.
- 39 percent The state's oil-producing region continues to create retail growth, and the third quarter sales and use tax report from the North Dakota tax commissioner showed retail activity was up 39 percent statewide compared to a year ago.
- 90 percent Increase in retail activity in Williston.

\$722 million - Williston's taxable sales for the last quarter exceeded Fargo's \$654 million, even though Williston's

population is 14,000 compared to Fargo's 105,000.

- 169 New drilling permits issued in October.
- \$1,233 McKenzie County's average weekly wage, compared to the North Dakota statewide average weekly wage of \$820 (3rd highest in the state)
- 40.7% McKenzie County's employment growth compared to the North Dakota statewide employment growth of 6.1% (3rd highest in the state)
