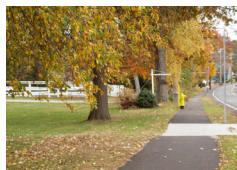

The Town of Littleton was founded in 1715 and is located in the Middlesex County area on the outer edge of suburban Boston. Originally supposed to be called "Lytleton," the town's name gained its current spelling due to a misspelling in the newspaper. Littleton was first settled by white settlers in 1686 and was officially incorporated by act of the Massachusetts General Court on November 2, 1714. The town was also the location of the sixth Praying Indian village established by John Eliot called Nashoba Plantation, on the land between Lake Nagog and Fort Pond.

The Littleton Parks, Recreation & Community Education Department is a town funded entity that provides year-round high quality indoor and outdoor recreation activities for children and adults in Littleton and the surrounding communities. It is the mission of Littleton's PRCE to increase the quality of life while serving the citizens of Littleton.
