# RESOLUTION TO PERMIT CORPORATE DAIRY FARM IN GRAY COUNTY, KANSAS

NOW, on this 16th day of May, 1994, at a regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners of Gray County, Kansas, the following Resolution is duly made, seconded and passed, permitting a dairy production facility, pursuant to Kansas law, to be established within the county as follows:

WHEREAS, Kansas law prohibits corporations, limited liability companies, and other entities from directly or indirectly owning, acquiring or otherwise obtaining or leasing agricultural land in the State of Kansas; provided, however, there are certain exceptions when the restrictions do not apply; and

WHEREAS, there has been enacted in the State of Kansas law which gives counties the right on a county-by-county basis to add an exception to the prohibitions on the ownership of agricultural land held or leased by a corporation or limited liability company if used as a dairy production facility; and

WHEREAS, in order for this exception to be applicable in a given county, the County Commissioners may enact a resolution making the exception applicable in their county; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners believe it is in the best interests of Gray County and its citizens that corporate dairy production be permitted in the county and that restrictions prohibiting ownership of agricultural land held or leased by a corporation or limited liability company for dairy production facilities be eliminated.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that in accordance with Kansas law, corporations and limited liability companies are hereby permitted to own agricultural land located in Gray County for use in the operation of "Dairy

Production Facilities", pursuant to Kansas law, and that dairy production facilities, including the land, structures and related equipment owned or leased by a corporation or limited liability company, shall be permitted to be established with Gray County, Kansas, and used for housing, breeding, breeding, milking or feeding of cows.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Kansas law be effective in Gray County, Kansas; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the above and foregoing Resolution be published once each week for two (2) consecutive weeks in <u>The Jacksonian</u> and in <u>The Montezuma Press</u>, and such Resolution shall take effect sixty (60) days after such final publication, unless a valid petition in opposition to the same is filed in accordance with Kansas law.

THE ABOVE AND FOREGOING RESOLUTION, having been duly made by motion and seconded, is approved by unanimous vote of the Board of County Commissioners of Gray County, Kansas, on this 16th day of May, 1994.
