2020 taxes payable in 2021 are: Lot 1 \$1,566.10 and Lot 3 \$1,214.88.



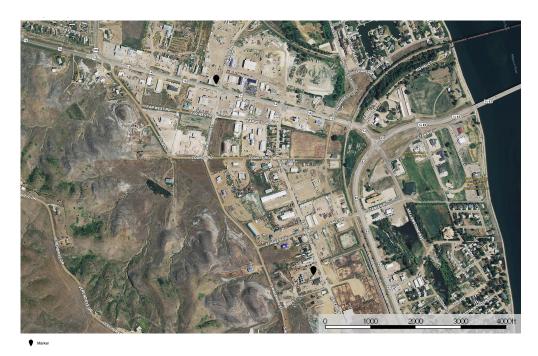

The broker must disclose in writing the types of agency and brokerage relationships the broker offers to consumers and to allow a consumer the right to choose or refuse among the various real estate relationships. The 5 following real estate relationships are permissible under South Dakota law. 7 X Single Agent-Seller's/Landlord's Agent: Works on behalf of the seller/landlord and owes duties to the seller/landlord, which include good faith, loyalty, and fidelity. The agent will negotiate on behalf of and act as an advocate for the seller/landlord. The agent may not disclose 8 confidential information without written permission of the seller or landlord. X Single Agent-Buyer's/Tenant's Agent: Works on behalf of the buyer/tenant and owes duties to the buyer/tenant which include good faith, 10 11 loyalty, and fidelity. The agent will negotiate on behalf of and act as an advocate for the buyer/tenant. The agent may not disclose confidential information without written permission of the buyer or tenant. 12 13 X Disclosed Limited Agent: Works on behalf of more than one client to a transaction, requiring the informed written consent of the clients before doing so. A limited agent may not disclose confidential information about one client to another without written permission releasing that 14 15 information. While working to put the transaction together, agents in a limited agency transaction cannot negotiate nor advocate solely on behalf of either the seller/landlord or buyer/tenant. A limited agent may not be able to continue to provide other fiduciary services previously 16 17 provided to the client. 18 □ Appointed Agent: Works on behalf of the seller/landlord or buyer/tenant and owes the same duties to the client as that of a single agent. A seller/landlord or buyer/tenant with an appointed agency agreement is represented by agents specifically named in the agreement. Any agents 19 of the firm not named in the agreement do not represent the seller/landlord or buyer/tenant. The named appointed agent acts solely on behalf of 20 21 his or her client and may only share confidential information about the client with the agent's responsible broker or the broker's designated 22 broker who is also named in the agreement. Other agents in the firm have no duties to the seller/landlord or buyer/tenant and may act solely on 23 behalf of another party in the transaction. The responsible broker and the broker's designee act as a disclosed limited agent when appointed 24 agents within the same firm are representing their respective clients in the same transaction. 25 ☐ Transaction Broker: Exercises reasonable skill and care in assisting one or more parties with a real estate transaction without being an 26 advocate for any party. Although the transaction broker will help facilitate the transaction, the licensee will serve as a neutral party, offering no 27 client-level services (such as negotiation) to the customer. The transaction broker may not disclose confidential information about a party to 28 another without written permission releasing that information. 29 Duties of a buyer, tenant, landlord, or seller: The duties of the real estate licensees in a real estate transaction do not relieve a party to a 30 31 transaction from the responsibility to protect the party's own interests. Persons should carefully read all documents to ensure that they adequately express their understanding of the transaction. If legal or tax advice is desired, consult a competent professional in that field. 32 33 34 All real estate licensees must provide disclosure of all actually known adverse material facts about the subject property or a party's 35 ability to perform its obligations. South Dakota law requires a written agreement which sets forth the duties and obligations of the parties as described in the brokerage 36 37 relationships itemized above. 38 The office policy of Hewitt Land Company, Inc.
