

PROPERTY DETAILS

Granite Lake presents an extraordinary opportunity in the heart of the Texas Hill Country. With its proximity to Austin and San Antonio, the allure of the Highland Lakes region, and the charm of Llano and Burnet counties, this crown jewel is a visual celebration of nature and is poised to become a sought-after destination. Whether you are looking for a private retreat, a development venture, or an investment opportunity, Granite Lake offers a unique canvas to realize your vision.

SURFACE WATER

The crown jewel of the property is the pristine, private granite lake with concrete spillway. There is direct canal access on the Colorado River (Lake LBJ) with approximately 100 feet of frontage, providing potential dock access to this constant-level boater's paradise. A small portion of the property by the canal is within the 100-year floodplain.

LAND

The 12.906 acres are mostly level and dotted with mature Live Oak trees throughout. In the spring, gorgeous bluebonnets and other wildflowers cover the landscape. Whitetail deer, turkey, dove, ducks, and a multitude of songbirds and small mammals frequent the area. Barbed wire fencing runs along the perimeter. The property is comprised of three parcels with approximately 1,050 feet of frontage on RR 2545 and two neighborhood road entrances.

UTILITIES

There is a 200-foot water well tested at 14 gallons per minute (in 2016) with a softener and UV sterilizer installed. Water to maintain the private lake is currently pumped from the Colorado River. LCRA has already agreed to allow the new owner to initiate a new permit. Electricity is provided by Central Texas Electric Co-op (CTEC), and wastewater is provided by Kingsland Municipal Utility District.

INCLUSIONS


Four tiny homes, a small office building, and all furnishings convey with the property, providing an immediate income stream as vacation rentals if desired.

RESTRICTIONS

The main 11.7-acre parcel is unrestricted. The two smaller tracts have neighborhood restrictions. Buyer to verify and comply with all county, state, and other jurisdictional regulations affecting the property for Buyer's intended use.







LOCATION OVERVIEW

KINGSLAND, TX

Kingsland is an unincorporated city that sits at the convergence of the Colorado and Llano rivers, where Inks Lake flows into Lake LBJ. It is just about 15 miles from Marble Falls, which is the regional retail, wholesale, trade and service center for a primary trade area of 75,000 people and a secondary trade area population of 108,000.

HIGHLAND LAKES REGION

Granite Lake is in a prime area of the Highland Lakes region of the Texas Hill Country, known for its scenic landscapes, outdoor activities, and vibrant communities. The Highland Lakes are a series of reservoirs created along the Colorado River encompassing Lake Buchanan, Inks Lake, Lake LBJ, Lake Marble Falls, Lake Travis, Lake Austin, and Lady Bird Lake in Austin. Granite Lake is minutes away from Lake LBJ, named after President Lyndon B. Johnson, spanning over 6,200 acres and a shoreline of approximately 150 miles. The area is a popular destination for boating, fishing, and water sports. Beyond its recreational appeal, the Highland Lakes contribute significantly to the water supply of the region. The combination of natural beauty and recreational offerings makes Lake LBJ and the surrounding Highland Lakes area a cherished gem in the Texas Hill Country.


Burnet and Llano Counties
