# **Hurd Wild West Ranch**

Nestled in the hills above the Rio Ruidoso and Rio Bonito, the Hurd Wild West Ranch offers a rare chance to own land shaped by history, beauty, and legacy. Originally part of the renowned Sentinel Ranch, founded by famed Southwestern artist Peter Hurd and his wife Henriette Wyeth, this 1,625± acre parcel reflects the same rugged landscapes that inspired their work. With ties to Lincoln County's Wild West past and a timeless artistic heritage, this is more than land—it's a story waiting to be continued.

Southwestern artist Peter Hurd was born in Roswell, NM in 1904.

After studying at the Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Arts and apprenticing under N.C. Wyeth, he married Wyeth's daughter, Henriette, in 1929. They returned to southern New Mexico, purchasing 40 acres in San Patricio. Over time, they expanded the property to more than 2,000 acres, calling it Sentinel Ranch. Inspired by the terrain of hilly plains and arroyos of the Hondo Valley, Peter's work often depicted the landscapes and people of the region—highlighting the rich rural life he cherished. He traded paintings for services and embedded himself in the local community. The setting allowed both Peter and Henriette to build a family and legacy rooted in the land and their art.



Peter passed in 1984. Today, their youngest son, Michael Hurd, oversees the family ranch, Sentinel Ranch, part of which lies north of U.S. 70 and is the subject property offered for sale. While the parcel is centered in San Patricio, it lays within literal and artistic proximity to the Hondo Valley—the downstream confluence of the Rio Bonito and Rio Ruidoso which forms the Rio Hondo.

Spanning approximately 1,625± deeded acres (2.5± square miles), this legacy property sits in the rugged hills between the Ruidoso and Bonito River sheds, just 20 miles east of Ruidoso. The Hurd Wild West Ranch is a rare opportunity to own a wilderness parcel steeped in Lincoln County's storied ranching past. Names like Billy the Kid, John Chisum, and John Tunstall helped shape the region's legacy, and this property continues that tradition. Whether you are seeking a personal hunting retreat, a long-term investment, or a legacy ranch for future generations, the Hurd Wild West Ranch offers all three.

### Land • Vegetation

The terrain ranges from 5,500 to 6,123 feet in elevation, transitioning from gently rolling hills to rugged slopes ideal for wildlife habitat. Vegetation includes native grasses, piñon-juniper woodland, several varieties of cactus, and mountain mahogany.

### Wildlife

Located in Game Management Unit 36, the ranch offers excellent hunting and wildlife viewing. Wildlife species include elk, mule deer, Barbary sheep, blue quail, dove, bear, mountain lion, and coyote.

### Infrastructure • Water Assets

Fencing generally follows the property boundary but requires maintenance.

Reliable water access is one of the ranch's strongest assets.

Wells • 1 total (depth and GPM unknown)

Above-Ground Storage Tank (in need of repair)

**Drinkers** • 1 on site (needs repair)

Water is reported to be of good quality.

Primary access from US 70 with a two-track road to the well site






